Dear GO Sweden students,

We are disappointed to share the news that due to COVID-19, our on-site partner in Sweden will not be hosting any study abroad programs this summer. The on-site partner network relies heavily on in-person connections to build networks and community, and right now, that isn't possible. That means that, unfortunately, **need to cancel the GO Sweden program for summer 2021.**

We are committed to keeping you on track for graduation while keeping your health and safety at the forefront. We understand that each of you and your families may have differing thoughts regarding how you would like to proceed, and we will support your decision. From the beginning, we have guaranteed to work with students to meet the cross-cultural requirement for graduation.

As you know, GO is designed to allow students to meet the <u>cross-cultural learning goals</u> of the SU Central Curriculum. The structure of the GO requirement typically requires a minimum of 2 weeks onsite in a cross-cultural immersion setting, book-ended by a 7 weeks' preparatory course and a 7 weeks' reflection course. Because of COVID-19, we have identified different options that would allow you to meet the cross-cultural learning goals, and therefore the cross-cultural requirement for graduation.

 Currently, we are still cautiously planning other summer 2021 programs. This may change as we keep a close watch on how the situation develops, but there are programs with spaces available. These programs will open for applications later this week – Shane can assist you in an expedited application process. If you would like to apply for a program that has open spaces, and/or discuss other summer programming, please reach out directly to <u>Shane</u>.

2. Participate in a Summer 2021 GO Your Way program

<u>GO Your Way program options</u> include pre-designed experiences such as study abroad courses in a broad range of subjects, volunteer, and internship programs (in fields such as medicine, veterinary, teaching, etc.) all through providers who coordinate housing and placements so you as the student do not have to coordinate all that on your own. Please <u>reach out to Shane</u> to learn more about these options.

3. Submit a virtual accommodation request

a. Based on feedback we have received from students concerned about travel, we have built a <u>COVID-19 accommodation request</u> application for approval to complete the cross-cultural requirement through a virtual program over summer 2021. We recommend setting up a meeting with <u>Molly</u> to discuss this option. These requests must be made by Feb. 15.

4. Participate in a Winter 2021/2022 GO Short or GO Your Way program.

a. Winter GO Short programs will be announced on mySU later this semester.

Dear Summer 2021 GO New Zealand students,

There have been some unfortunate developments regarding international travel that impact our New Zealand program so I want to share with you what we know now.

The New Zealand government has announced that they will not begin vaccination of the general public until June 2021 and that they will keep their very strict border restrictions in place until nearly all New Zealanders are protected from the Coronavirus. So that means no entry for any non-citizen of New Zealand.

These timelines can change. But at this point it seems clear that **we will not be able to travel to New Zealand in June as planned.** This is really disappointing news for all of us.
